Dryland	Same as above in the KS/MO areas, but add PS0134 VPR in the south as early-earlies and in the north as an early
Irrigation	Same as above, but include PS0844 V32

SOYBEAN: NE & IA - NORTH

Dryland	Still gathering data
Irrigation	2833XF, 322E3, 3313XF, 240E3
